<p>1 Kookaburra In eastern Australia, the raucous cackle of the Laughing Kookaburra is an essential feature of the dawn chorus</p>		<p>11 Rainbow Lorikeet Unmistakable with its bright red beak and colourful plumage. Both sexes look alike, with a blue head and belly, green wings</p>	
<p>2 Kingfisher Kingfishers or Alcedinidae are a family of small to medium-sized, brightly colored birds.</p>		<p>12 Ring neck Blue wren Vibrant blue with black bands at the base of their tail, breast and beak. A black band is also found around the eyes.</p>	
<p>3 Rosella Rosella means "broad-tailed" or "flat-tailed", reflecting a feature common to the rosellas.</p>		<p>13 Super Crested Cockatoo A highly intelligent bird, they are well known in aviculture, although they can be demanding pets.</p>	
<p>4 Australian King Parrot Australian King-Parrots are the only Australian parrots with a completely red head Females have a completely green head and breast.</p>		<p>14 Wedge Tail Eagle has long wings, a characteristic long, wedge-shaped tail, and legs that are feathered all the way to the base.</p>	
<p>5 Yellow Tail Cockatoo feed on the seeds of native shrubs and trees, especially banksias, hakeas and casuarinas.</p>		<p>15 Willy Wagtail The largest, and most well-known, of the Australian fantails. The plumage is black above with a white belly.</p>	
<p>6 Magpie Geese (red Bill) Magpie geese are social animals, living in flocks. These flocks travel together when migrating between areas during the wet and dry seasons.</p>		<p>16 Bower Bird Renowned for their unique courtship behaviour, where males build a structure and decorate it.</p>	
<p>7 White Head Pigeon Has a distinctive white head, neck and breast, which sometimes have an orange or greyish wash.</p>		<p>17 Crow Are black and usually build their bulky stick nests in the tops of tall eucalypts, generally in the shade.</p>	
<p>8 Crested Pigeon Have a conspicuous thin black crest. Most of the plumage is grey-brown, becoming pink on the underparts.</p>		<p>18 Tawny Frogmouth With their nocturnal habit and owl-like appearance, Tawny Frogmouths are often confused with owls.</p>	
<p>9 Magpie Magpies are birds of the Corvidae family and they are widely considered to be very intelligent creatures</p>		<p>19 Geese A goose is a bird of any of several waterfowl species in the family Anatidae. Other birds, have "goose" in their name.</p>	
<p>10 Honey Eater Honeyeaters eat insects, pollen, berries and manna. They also like Eucalypts and other Australian trees.</p>		<p>20 Galah Like cockatoos, the Galah is an excellent mimic of voices and sounds, along with their colour and hilarious personalities.</p>
